We will also be represented at the EOD Memorial at Eglin AFB in Florida.

EXPLOSIVE HARVESTING TEAM GROWS

MS. CHHUM AND LIM JOIN OUR TEAM IN CAMBODIA

Our Explosive Harvesting Program (EHP) recently expanded with the addition of two new team members, CMAC LV2 EOD technicians, Chhum Nimol and Lim Srey Sa. Both are currently in intensive training designed to familiarize them with our EHP's

rigorous SOPs, a comprehensive understanding of our demolition, cutting, and harvesting techniques, alongside stringent safety procedures.

Both Nimol and Srey Sa are as excited to join the team and further develop their knowledge as we are to have them on board.

The Explosive Harvesting Program continues to have a profound and positive impact in Cambodia. To date:

- 290,897 ordnance destroyed
- 45,196 UXO processed.
- 83,132 kg explosives harvested
- 611,661 demolition charges created

As we continue to evolve and expand our operations, we remain dedicated to the principles of innovation, safety, and community engagement.
